Making Field Day Plans

The May meeting of the Heart of America Radio Club will be largely devoted to Field Day 2019 planning. ARRL Field Day is June 22 and 23, 2019. The meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 21 at the American Red Cross office at 6601 Winchester 64133 at 7:00 p.m.

There is more than one way to the location. Here is one of the routes. From Sixty-third Street, turn south on Winchester Avenue at the traffic signal. Drive up a long hill for three blocks. You will pass the Spectrum office on the right. The next building on the right is 6601 Winchester Avenue. Parking space surrounds the building, but park in front.

The front door of the building will be locked at the time of the meeting. Before the meeting you will be greeted at the door. If you arrive after 7 o'clock, call for WØRR on 146.940 MHz. simplex, because reaching the 94 repeater using an HT from inside the building is difficult. You might also use 94 simplex to obtain talk-in directions if you are close by.

Help Needed for Corporate Challenge Duathlon

Help is needed for the Kansas City Corporate Challenge Duathlon on Sunday, June 9.

The event is held at Shawnee Mission Park at Renner Road and 77th Street. Hams with either 2-meter mobile or handheld are needed. The Kansas City Corporate Challenge benefits a charity each year. The Kansas City Metro Special Olympics is the beneficiary. One hundred dollars from each company's entry fee will be donated to Special Olympics resulting in support of more than 4,000 athletes in Missouri and Kansas. Proceeds from concessions at various events will also benefit Kansas City Metro Special Olympics.

This year is the Kansas City Corporate Challenge celebrates 40 years and offers more than 30,000 participants from 220 companies the opportunity to compete in 30 individual and team sports in 9 divisions.

Basic Electrical Units Are Tweaked

According to an Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers magazine, "Spectrum" November 18, 2018, article the definition behind the basic electrical units will change effective on May 20, 2019. The changes are more academic than anything impacting the average ham. The minor refinement will not require recalibration of your amateur instrumentation.

The International Bureau of Weights and Measures (BIPM) redefines four base units in terms of fundamental constants in nature. Those include the base units of the ampere, kelvin, kilogram, and mole.

The redefinition of units links every unit to a fixed figure: a fundamental constant in nature. And many of the units' definitions will reference one another.

Perhaps the biggest—and certainly the buzziest—change is to the kilogram, the last base unit to be defined by a physical artifact. The International Prototype Kilogram, or Le Grand K as it is affectionately known, is a cylinder made of platinum and iridium, housed in a trio of bell jars in Paris and held under lock and key. It's taken out only to measure against official replicas of the kilogram, in an intensely careful process.

With the revamp, the kilogram will now be defined in terms of the Planck constant—which itself will be given a fixed numerical value—and can then be realized by methods like the Kibble (watt) balance or the Avogadro constant.

The amp, currently defined as the magnetic force between two infinitely long wires at a certain distance apart that carry the same charge, will now be defined in terms of the elementary charge. The BIPM noted in a statement that, "For the vast majority of measurement users, no action need be taken as the volt will change by about 0.1 parts per million and the ohm will change by even less."
