There is more than one way to the location. Here is one of the routes. From Sixty-third Street, turn south on Winchester Avenue at the traffic signal. Drive up a long hill for three blocks. You will pass the Spectrum office on the right. The next building on the right is 6601 Winchester Avenue. Parking space surrounds the building, but park in front.

The front door of the building will be locked at the time of the meeting. Before the meeting you will be greeted at the door. If you arrive after 7 o'clock, call for WØRR on 146.940 MHz. simplex, because reaching the 94 repeater using an HT from inside the building is difficult. You might also use 94 simplex to obtain talk-in directions if you are close by.

There was a longer as well as a shorter triathlon distance. That meant that there were four different swim distances, four different bike distances and four different run distances to monitor.

HARC Field Day 2019

This year the Heart of America Radio Club operated the 2019 ARRL Field Day from the Kansas City, Missouri Emergency Operation Center. Earlier plans had the operation out of the city's amateur radio trailer to be located at Hodge Park. However the cost of temporary sanitary facilities proved to exceed our budgeted Field Day funds. So it was decided to operate from the EOC where indoor plumbing was already in existence.

Craig Schley, KAØFSP, our Field Day captain and host at the EOC faced challenge after challenge trying to get all three of our HF stations up and operating and then keeping them operating. Could we obtain 100 bonus points for every time Schley exclaimed, "Everything's broke?"

Recall there was a lightening storm that caused the cancellation of some Field Day operations and truncated many others in the area. The threat of severe and flooding weather brought the EOC to an activated state. So there was all sorts of activity going on Saturday evening. We were eating a dinner that night of Subway sandwiches when the Emergency Manager walk in the room and said the EOC was being activated. Later that evening, after the activation was concluded and the EOC had only a few hams left operating, Schley declared himself exhausted and announced the Field Day operations at the EOC suspended so we could all go home and get some rest.

We had a similar situation last year while operating at the Red Cross with the air conditioning not working. We decided to leave the radios and return to operating in the morning.

The next morning we were able to establish three HF stations operating at once.

Our stations made 231 contacts on the bands 40 through 10 meters. We made 2 phone contacts, 134 CW contacts and 95 digital contacts. These contacts produced 460 QSO points. The power multiplier of two produced 920 claimed points. To that score bonus points of 850 were added resulting in a claimed score of 1770 points.

At the July club meeting we will recap and discuss these results. Please attend.
