Know Your Amplifier Classes

You probably have heard of some of the various older amplifier classes. There is the class-A amplifier, the class-B amplifier, the class-AB amplifier and the class-C amplifier. But what about the class-D, E, F, G and H amplifiers?

A class-D amplifier or switching amplifier is an electronic amplifier in which the amplifying devices, usually MOSFETs, operate as electronic switches, and not as linear gain devices as in some other amplifiers. They operate by rapidly switching back and forth between the supply rails, being fed by a modulator using pulse width, pulse density, or related techniques to encode the audio input into a pulse train. The audio escapes through a simple low-pass filter into the loud-speaker. The high-frequency pulses are blocked. Since the pairs of output transistors are never conducting at the same time, there is no other path for current to flow other than through low-pass filter to the output. For this reason, efficiency for this amplifier can exceed 90%.

The class-E, F, G and H amplifiers are variations of the switching amplifier concept. While the Class-D amplifier is useful in amplifying audio signals, the class-E, F, G and H amplifiers each have their own advantages.

U-Kid's Triathlon

Kill Creek Park, near Olathe was the site of the last Heart of America Radio club coordinated public service event of 2019. The U-Kid's Triathlon was held on Saturday, August 24. The triathlon is designed for youngsters of both genders ages fourteen years and younger. The eleven to fourteen year age group starts the swim first. The age group rides the bike course when the swim is completed and then runs the run course. About 40 minutes after the first older group of triathletes began their swim, the six to ten year old group begin their swim. The swim is followed by bike and run stages about half the distance of the older triathletes. An hour into the events the five and younger kids splash, bike, or trike and then run under the supervision of their parents.
